Angel Bat Dawid

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Children Of The Sky is a trio founded by composer, arranger and multiinstrumentalist Isaiah Collier. The concept of this project was to bring the three respective air signs, Libra, Gemini, Aquarius into one ensemble. Collier had decided to gather the dynamic and fierce Angel Bat Dawid on Clarinet. Along with the astute and poised Oliva Harris on the cello. The conversation between the tenor saxophone, cello, and bass Clarinet is sweet and full. 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These three pieces, Blueberry Skies, Tied Up, and Ocean Wind, are from a soon to be project called Live in Peace, by Anaiet. Heavily influenced by Lauryn Hill's MTV Unplugged 2.0, the project focuses heavily on lyricism with hints of imagery, extended metaphor and etc., accompanied by the rawness of acoustic guitar and voice. Some themes throughout the project, as seen here, are tales of lost love, death, and the existential sadness that comes with being human and how some of us choose to cope with it. These songs reflect many of my feelings as well as those that I've seen portrayed by friends, loved ones and the people around me. As an artist I believe it is essential to create music inspired by the life around you, and to record those moments in a way that will find its way into the hearts of listeners all over the world, because life is a human experience.

I also enjoy the personal sentiment this project has to me, as there's some things that appear that you'll only "know if you know". Being from Chicago, for example, people here refer to loose cigarettes as "squares", hence the lyric "Am I addicted to you just as much as these squares?"

It's the small things that have the biggest impact.

I genuinely hope you enjoy this experience.

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Biographies

Angel Bat Dawid is a Black American Composer, Improviser, Clarinetist, Pianist, Vocalist & DJ. Her critically acclaimed Album " The Oracle", released by Chicago label International Anthem was created entirely alone- performing, overdubbing & mixing all instruments & voices by herself- recorded using only her cell phone in various locations, from London UK to Cape Town RSA. In the fall of 2019, she composed and premiered "Requiem for Jazz" at the Hyde Park Jazz Festival, and in 2020 composed "Peace: A Suite for Skylanding" commissioned by the Art Institute of Chicago for Yoko Ono's outdoor Skylanding Installation. Angel tours internationally with her septet "Tha Brothahood" and released their album LIVE making NPR's best of 2020 list. She also leads the all-woman trio Sistazz of the Nitty Gritty. As half of the duo group DAOUI Angel & sound artist Oui Ennui produced, mixed and self-released the album "Message from the DAOUI" which was featured at Tusk Festival 2020. Angel is the clarinetist in Damon Locks Black Monument Ensemble and hosts a monthly music show on NTS Radio.

Anaiet is an emerging composer, pianist, and vocalist from the Great Black music traditions of Chicago. Anaiet is influenced by a myriad of musical backgrounds, textures and sounds relying heavily on spontaneous compositions and improvisation. She has performed for Elastic Arts 3rd Annual Benefit Concert, Merkin Concert Hall at the Kauffman Center of the Performing Arts annual Ecstatic Music Festival in New York, the New Music Circle Festival in St Louis and was recently featured on Fulcrum Point New Music Project's 22nd Annual Concert for Peace.

Isaiah Collier is a Chicago/Brooklyn based multi-instrumentalist, composer, arranger, curator, activist, motivational speaker and educator. Collier is most known for his work as a saxophonist, and drummer with his group "*Isaiah Collier & The Chosen Few*". Collier's sound and approach is drawn from the influences of John Coltrane, Roscoe Mitchell, Wayne Shorter, Ari Brown and Gene Ammons. Collier has shared the stage with many distinguished artists—Chance The Rapper, Lewis Nash, Waddada Leo Smith III, Junius Paul, James Carter, Rene Marie, Marquis Hill, Bennie Maupin, Rudy Van Gelder, Angel Bat Dawid, Kahil El'Zabar and many more. Mr. Collier has

performed at The Jazz Showcase, Dizzy's Club Coca Cola, Lithuania Jazz Festival, The White House, Chicago Jazz Festival, New York Winter Jazz Festival, The Hyde Park Jazz Festival, Sons D'hiver Festival (Paris), The Logan Center, The Harris Theatre. Isaiah Collier is also a former fellow of the prestigious Dave Brubeck Institute Stockton,Ca.

Cellist **Olivia J. P. Harris** is an artist dedicated to the performance, instruction, and growth of new music. In addition to being an active soloist, she is a founding member of new music duo, Mazumal. Olivia is enthusiastic about collaborating across genres and mediums and has played alongside dancers, visual artists, actors, and singer-songwriters. Olivia's principal instructors include Astrid Schween, Rhonda Rider, Jeffrey Zeigler, and Mihai Tetel

Julian Terrell Otis is a vocalist dedicated to the advancement of Black music in America, spanning genres from creative music and jazz, to contemporary classical. His work explores the limitless possibilities of his instrument's expressive capacity through song, improvisation, and theater. Known for bringing fresh perspective, nuance, and "high drama" to the contemporary music world, the integration of performance "live art" elements is of particular interest to him. Otis's experiences have led him to create the male soloist role in George E. Lewis' chamber opera, *Afterword*, on both domestic and international stages. In exploring the life and work of Julius Eastman, Otis has performed his solo work, *Prelude for the Holy Presence of Joan of Arc*. He revived Peter Maxwell Davies' *Eight Songs for a Mad King* at the inaugural Bang on a Can All Star's Loud Weekend, and is devising works focusing on improvisation, electronics, and movement. *All the Pretty Flowers* is his first recording project of improvised music and poetry. Committed to community empowerment, he led an improvised jam for South Side Chicago communities called Self Care =
