Biographies



Angelo Hart has always had a unique and expressive approach to his instrument. Angelo has studied jazz and classical masters such as Thelonius Monk, Art Tatum, Cecil Taylor, Oscar Peterson, Keith Jarrett, Herbie Hancock, Chick Corea, Debussy, Liszt, Chopin, Beethoven, and many more. He approaches the piano with command and finesse, displaying a unique relationship and connection between the two of them.



Marion Sly Mallard is a Chicago-based artist and upcoming performing bassist and composer in the city. In addition to performing with musicians all over and around the city, Marion has many pursuits in the arts - composition, recording studio work, band-leading, music production/mixing, teaching, and photography. Originally from Decatur, IL, Marion grew up with music in her life in many forms. She has been ranked among the top young bassists in Illinois as she was named the top bassist in the Honors Big Band at the ILMEA All-State Jazz Division, and has been a recipient of the Louis Armstrong Jazz Award

for her musicianship. Marion moved to Chicago in 2020 to pursue a degree in Jazz Studies at the DePaul University School of Music, and to expand her artistry through many forms. She is currently involved in many performing groups throughout the Chicago music scene, including those under her own name, as well as teaching and working on many collaborations with some of the other top musicians in Chicago today.



Corey Wilkes is an award-winning, highly acclaimed musician, producer, actor, and composer who has captivated audiences around the world with his mesmerizing trumpet playing and unique musical vision. He began his musical journey at a young age and was awarded a full scholarship to attend the prestigious Berklee College of Music in Boston. After graduating, he became an in-demand touring and recording artist, collaborating with some of the biggest names in jazz and beyond, including the Art Ensemble of Chicago, Roy Hargrove, Kahil El Zabar, James Carter, Tedeschi Trucks Band, Nicole Mitchell, Dr. Lonnie Smith, Makaya McCraven and many more.



Quentin Biardeau is a musician of the extremes: he likes to throw himself into long saxophonistic streaks, where his thick tenor sound works wonders, as he likes to dare to ridicule the spirit of musical seriousness—Nothing scares him. He stood out for his participation in projects as diverse as Bobun Fever, the Machaut Quartet and Freaks.



Etienne Ziemniak is an effusive drummer and co-founder of the Capsul Collectif in Tours, a gatherings of creative musicians who make jazz life. He not only has one of the most powerful strikes of the younger generation, his game is just as precise and crackling.



Françoise Dô observes silence. In a realistic creative process, she uses writing and theatrical narrative to explore taboos and unspoken words within families and society. In an aesthetic of sober and contemporary staging, she seeks through dramaturgy to question emotions behind words.
